The Black Hills Rapids are excited to host the 2021 Winter Classic Event. We have the following best practices put in place to provide a safe soccer environment for everyone attending. Please make sure you are following all national, state, local, SDYSA, and BHR guidelines during this event.

Best Practices for Team Personnel (Coaches/Managers) & Players:

- Coaches and Players are required to wear masks on the sideline unless they are on the court playing/warming up
- NO postgame handshakes or any other type of physical contacts are permitted.
- Spitting will be a no tolerance rule.
- Only authorized personnel allowed on the benches are players, coaches and tournament officials
- Only authorized personnel allowed on the fields are players, coaches, referees, tournament staff, and medical staff
 - Exceptions may be made for medical issues
- Only 2 spectators per rostered player (all spectators expected to adhere to social distancing guidelines)
- Recommended to have no team coolers or shared common sources of water/Gatorade, etc.
- Hand Sanitizer stations will be set up throughout the Civic Center
- All players, coaches, and spectators must leave the field immediately after the game (No longer than 10 minutes).
- These protocols will be actively distributed to teams prior to attending the event as well as reminded of them during the event
- Social distancing is always highly recommended
- Anyone who is sick or becomes ill during the event should stay home and away from the fields

Best Practices for Parents/Spectators:

- All spectators must wear masks
- Only 2 spectators per rostered player (all spectators are expected to adhere to social distancing guidelines)
- Recommended to symptom check before coming to the fields (Check players as well)
- Anyone who is sick or experiencing symptoms associated with COVID-19 should stay home.
- Spectators must leave immediately after the game (No longer than 10 minutes)

By registering, attending, and entering the event facilities, all participants, including, but not limited to, coaches, players, parents, spectators, event staff, vendors, partners, medical staff, referees, and administrators agree to follow all national, state, local, SDYSA, and BHR guidelines, and assume all responsibility of risk in attending the Fright Fest 2020 Tournament. The understanding of the risk and agreeing to not indemnify BHR or its staff and volunteers nor hold them responsible for any sickness or health condition that may result from attending the event.
